“Building Bridges: Partnerships in Crime Analysis”

Entries for the 2009 IACA/AACA Bulletin Contest are now being accepted. If your analytical product has received rave reviews by your own department, outside agencies or your peers— please enter to win! Take the opportunity to gain recognition for your hard work at an international level. Awards will be given out during the IACA Business Meeting on Wednesday, October 14.

Entries will be broken down into the following categories:

TACTICAL CRIME BULLETINS: Bulletins that have been created for patrol or detective divisions to aid in solving a tactical crime series. This includes crime pattern, series and suspect information. These bulletins are generally no more than two pages.

CRIME/INTELLIGENCE CHARTING: Products including all link charts, timelines, flowcharts, and other investigative/intelligence based tools. Data may include, but is not limited to known associations, phone tolls, cash flow, etc.

CRIME MAPS: All maps that represent a crimes series, pattern or trend. Other aspects of analysis may be incorporated, however the map should be the main focus of this product.

STATISTICAL REPORTS: Reports that are crime-based and that may be produced on a daily, weekly, or monthly basis. This may include “CompStat” or reports that are a summation of a case in which crime analysis was involved. These reports are usually several pages and are usually strategic or administrative in nature.

INTELLIGENCE PRODUCTS: Products that are based on gang, terrorism, or homeland security intelligence analysis. This may include daily, weekly or monthly briefs, request for information (RFI’s), summaries, assessments, situational intelligence reports (SIR’s), post-incident analysis, etc.

- Entries must be received by Friday, September 11, 2009
- Entries must be submitted by email to bulletincontest@iaca.net (preferably in PDF)
- Include your name, contact information and category you wish to enter
- Author must be a member of IACA or AACA
- Product must have been created between November 2008 and August 2009
- Limit of one entry per person
- Confidential/sensitive material should be blacked out
- Analysis must be a part of the bulletin, not just a presentation of the data
- Judges will be looking for the best quality presentation of data (including grammar, punctuation, neatness, spelling, etc.)
