- 9:00 AM: Aimee Curry introduced Chief Tom Ryff who welcomed the group. He posed questions to the attendees about how much analysis techniques have changed in the last ten years and what is coming next. He stressed the importance of keeping up to date with technology and trends and emphasized the importance of crime analysts' duties during these tough economic times.
- 9:15 AM: Aimee introduced Brian Napolitano, Tempe Police Department. Brian presented his successful work on the "Shady Bandit Series." He used histograms and sequential mapping to provide his officers with up-to-the-minute information on where and when the bandit would strike next. The offender was eventually arrested and tied to the 9 robberies in the series. Brian also used the "raster calculator" tool in his Excel program to predict future offenses.
